

## Appendix A: NCIL Mandatory Criteria

Criteria	Pass / Fail
<p><b>1</b> Does the project meet the CIL Regulations?</p> <p><i>CIL Regulation 59F 3) The charging authority may use the CIL to which this regulation applies, or cause it to be used, to support the development of the relevant area by funding-</i></p> <p><i>(a) the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or</i></p> <p><i>(b) anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area</i></p>	<p>If the bid fails against this criterion, it cannot be considered further.</p>
<p><b>2</b> Is there enough NCIL funding available in the ward where the project is to take place?</p>	<p>The bid will fail if there is not enough NCIL available in the ward to fund a project unless it has been agreed that another ward will fully/part fund the project to meet the shortfall. This will be considered as a multiward bid and criterion 5 will also apply. If the bid fails against this criterion, it cannot be considered further.</p>
<p><b>3</b> The project does not require additional ongoing revenue funding in its delivery or its operation. If ongoing costs are required, does it identify how additional revenue funding will be met from funding sources other than NCIL?</p>	<p>The bid will fail if it is not clear on the amount and timescales of future revenue funding required. If the bid fails against this criterion, it cannot be considered further.</p>
<p><b>4</b> Is the bid for a project within the Borough?</p> <p>Projects outside of the Borough will not be eligible for RBKC NCIL funding. An exception would be where cross-borough NCIL funding can be secured.</p>	<p>The bid will pass if the project is within the Borough or if cross-borough funding can be secured. If the bid fails against this criterion, it cannot be considered further.</p>

Criteria	Pass / Fail
<p><b>5</b> <b><i>Applied to Multi Ward bids only:</i></b></p> <p><i>The bid seeks an equal amount from each ward and is there is enough NCIL funding available in each of the wards where the project will take place.</i></p> <p><i>This will normally be an equal amount from each of the wards where NCIL is being sought from unless it has already been agreed that another ward will fully/part fund the project to meet the shortfall. Details of this agreement must be set out in the application. If there is no agreement, then an exceptional reason must be detailed in the application.</i></p>	<p>The bid will fail if there is not enough NCIL available in the wards to fund the project, if an equal amount of NCIL from each ward has not been clearly stated, or if details that another ward has agreed to fully/part fund the project has not been provided, or an exceptional reason for different amounts has not been provided. If the bid fails against this criterion, it cannot be considered further.</p>
<p><b>6</b> Can the project be delivered without the involvement of other stakeholders outside of the Council's control?</p> <p>For example, private or other public landowners whose permission may be required. If this is the case, then details of support/ relevant permissions must be obtained and provided with the NCIL Bid.</p> <p>Projects that relate to infrastructure owned by another public / private body or on TfL Red Routes will also require details of support / relevant permissions alongside the NCIL Bid.</p>	<p>The bid will fail if the project cannot be delivered without the involvement of other stakeholders outside of the Council's control and confirmation of support / relevant permissions have not been provided to support the bid. If the bid fails it cannot be considered further as delivery cannot be ensured.</p>
